

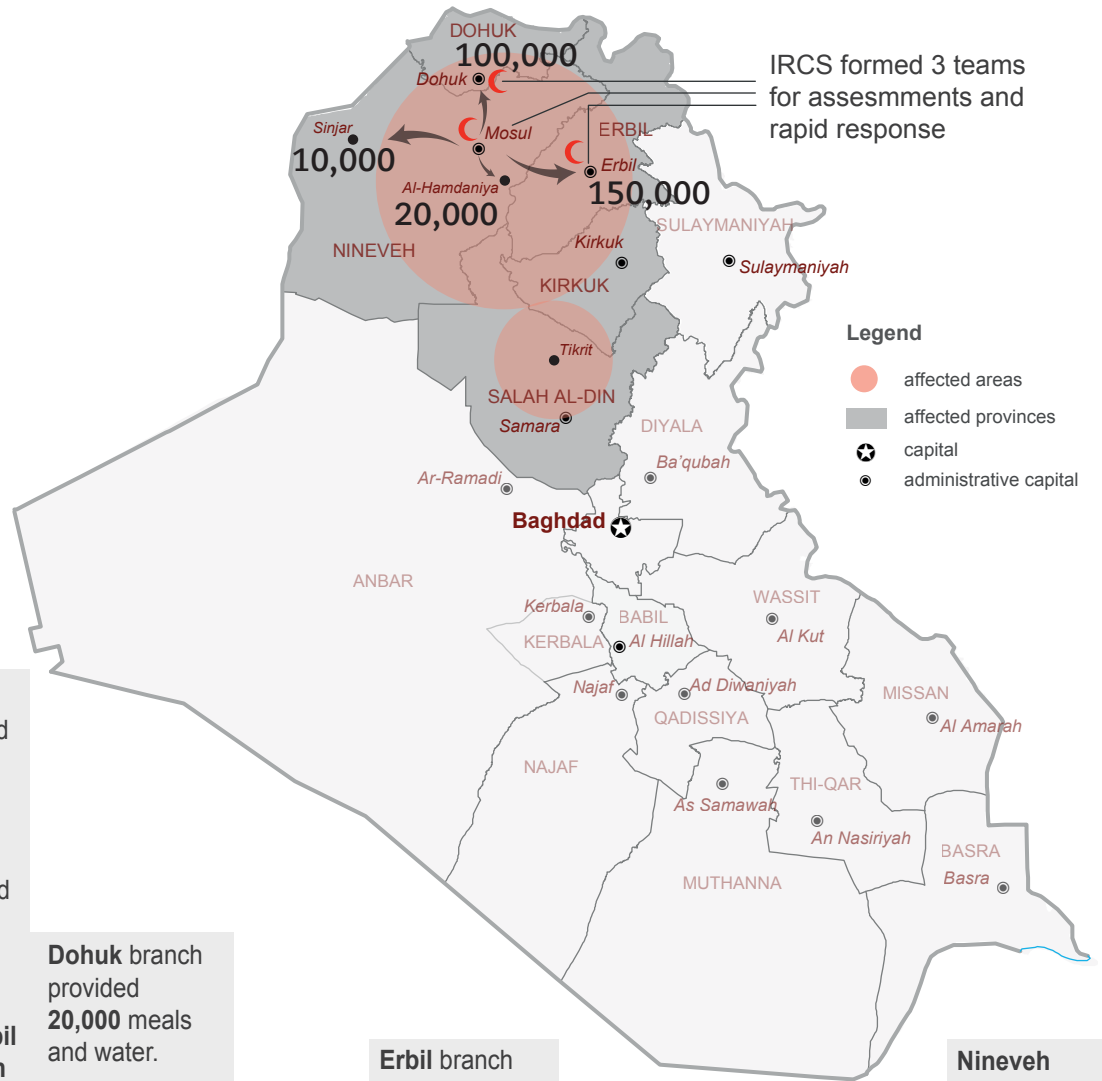
IRAQ population movement

The **IRAQ RED CRESCENT SOCIETY** response

The humanitarian situation in Iraq took a dramatic turn on 10 June when the security situation in the provinces of Nineveh and Salah Al-Din deteriorated. This has resulted in a massive displacement of people estimated to stand at more than 54,000 families from Mosul city with the number rising due to the continuing influx of families searching for safe haven.

TIMELINE

Erbil branch assessed the number of displaced persons to be approx. **20,000**. With the support of the office of the Governor of Erbil, 100 tents were provided along with relief items to the displaced families.

Dohuk branch provided **10,000** meals and water..

Erbil: HQ team and Erbil branch visited the families hosted in mosques and schools.

The border between **Erbil** and **Nineveh** provinces was opened and displaced families were accommodated in mosques, schools and relatives' houses.

Dohuk branch provided **20,000** meals and water.

Erbil branch provided **100** tents **150** coolers **300** mattresses **600** blankets

Erbil branch provided **300** meals and water bottles to 750 persons.

Iraq population movement DREF allocated by IFRC.

Erbil branch provided **1,150** meals and water to 1,750 persons.

Erbil branch provided **800** meals and water to 800 persons.

Nineveh branch provided **4,000** meals (morning & evening) and water to 2,000 persons.

Erbil: **IFRC** deployed surge capacity.
