

## ***TURKEY: EARTHQUAKES***

*01 December  
2000*

*situation report no. 47*

*period covered: 14 October 2000 - 24 November 2000*

*The completion and inauguration of several Red Cross and Red Crescent coordinated construction and rehabilitation projects were among the key activities of the period under review. At the same time, the pace of training programmes for Turkish Red Crescent Society (TRCS) staff have taken on an accelerated momentum. Frequent earthquakes, some with a Richter scale magnitude of over 5.0, illustrate the importance of ongoing TRCS capacity building activities, supported by the International Federation delegation and sister societies.*

### ***The context***

In the second half of 1999, north-western Turkey, the country's most densely populated region and industrial heartland, was struck by two massive earthquakes in less than three months. The first, centred on the industrial city of Izmit, on 17 August 1999, left 17,100 people dead and a further 44,000 injured. On the day of the catastrophe, the Turkish government declared a state of emergency and requested international assistance. The International Federation immediately launched a preliminary appeal, followed by a full appeal for CHF 65 million on 8 September 1999. The death toll from a second major quake - in the Bolu/Düzce region, on 12 November 1999 - reached 845, with injuries to nearly 5,000 people. An estimated 400,000 buildings either collapsed or were badly damaged by the two earthquakes.

### ***Update***

Earthquake-hit communities gathered on the morning of 12 November 2000 in Düzce, to commemorate the first anniversary of a deadly earthquake which killed 845 people in Düzce, Bolu and Kaynasli in western Turkey. Several international and local organizations, including the TRCS and the International Federation, participated in a series of activities organized in Bolu and Düzce. Early next morning, a

moderate earthquake with a magnitude of 4.3, sent terrified residents rushing out of their homes. There were no reports of injuries or damage.

A series of tremors ranging from 2.9 to 5.5 on the Richter scale were recorded during this time-frame by the Kandilli Observatory in Istanbul. The strongest quake, recorded on 15 November, had an epicentre near a town located in a mountainous area where the borders of Turkey, Iran and Iraq converge. Although an earthquake of this strength can cause considerable damage, there were no reports of injuries and damage in this sparsely populated region. The earthquake was felt in the neighboring provinces of Diyarbakir and Van. Eastern Anatolia was also shaken by two earthquakes on 23 November, one of a 5.5 magnitude. No injuries or damage was reported.

## ***Red Cross/Red Crescent action***

### **Turkish Red Crescent Society**

'TRCS Week' started on October 28 with a press conference at which the TRCS President announced that a blood products factory will be built on the initiative of the recently incorporated Blood and Health Services (KANSAS). The factory, which will be inaugurated within the next three months, is expected to not only meet demands for blood products in the country and stem the import of tainted blood into the country, but also start exporting blood products within the next four years. In conjunction with TRCS week, a blood donation campaign was launched, expected to attract approximately 250,000 civilian and army blood donors.

The director of the TRCS international relations department traveled to Switzerland in mid-November for a familiarization programme, including meetings with representatives of the ICRC, the International Federation and the Swiss Red Cross.

The TRCS held an inauguration ceremony for two facilities it constructed in the town of Bandirma in the Marmara Region: a 35-bed elderly care centre and a 188-bed girls dormitory.

### **International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies**

*Disaster Response Preparedness and Management (DRPM):* To accelerate the implementation of the envisaged disaster preparedness, communications and first aid programmes of the TRCS, four coordination meetings were held between TRCS, the Federation delegation, American Red Cross (ARC), German Red Cross (GRC) and the Spanish Red Cross during the review period. The meetings were focused on: preparation and production of standard disaster preparedness and first aid training materials; organization of training workshops for the staff and volunteers of TRCS; selection of the appropriate communication equipment; equipping and automating the warehouses; an exchange programme for staff and volunteers; and participation, assistance and facilitation of the GRC's assessment of branch capacity in the earthquake regions. The coordination meetings for DRPM are held every week.

The TRCS and Federation have produced 30,000 copies of booklets and public education material on earthquakes. The distribution of the materials is being carried out by the 654 TRCS branches.

ARC sponsored two visits of TRCS and its Ankara staff to the Society's headquarters and several branches in the United States. The aim was to provide background information about alternative models for the development of an emergency operations centre (EOC), volunteer system, training systems, and other initiatives within DRPM.

The American Red Cross (ARC) in Ankara also hosted a sabbatical visit by a disaster response training specialist from the US to illustrate ARC's model of course and training system development to the TRCS. Participants in a workshop demonstration included TRCS, Federation, and ARC staff.

The ARC is supporting TRCS to develop consolidated project descriptions for the EOC, for the training system, and for coordination of the various procurement processes. TRCS and ARC are nearing completion of an initial design proposal for the EOC.

Furthermore, the ARC is exploring the possibility of extending organizational development and DRPM activities to TRCS branches in the Istanbul area. ARC also signed a project agreement in collaboration with TRCS, with Kandilli Observatory in Istanbul to support the development of community-level risk maps for Istanbul metropolitan area.

The Federation delegation collaborated with the ARC to hire a training and methods officer for the DRPM team to further support TRCS in coordinating a medium-term training programme and a longer-term development of comprehensive training systems.

The German Red Cross (GRC) and TRCS organized a one week training session in Yeniköy where participants from TRCS branches and health ministry regional staff learnt about the fundamental principles and components of the Red Cross Red Crescent Movement and various disaster response tools and systems. The Norwegian Red Cross (NRC) also joined the seminar in Yeniköy and later in Ankara where the establishment of future training programmes was discussed with the Federation delegation and TRCS.

*Logistics:* The TRCS and the Federation delegation assigned three participants for the basic logistics workshop in Budapest from 7 to 11 November; one was fully funded by the TRCS. Future training in logistics is planned by the TRCS in cooperation with the Federation. The ARC and the TRCS are collaborating to standardize the procurement processes for purchases, including developing a reference manual of specifications and model tender documents with support from the Federation.

The Federation delegation is presently in the process of procuring equipment such as beds, wardrobes, and kitchen equipment, for the Bolu Arts and Music School. The school, which was rebuilt after the 1999 earthquakes, will be inaugurated on 4 December.

The ARC is assisting the TRCS with the replenishment of stocks of winter tents and response materials and equipment. The tender evaluation for the purchase of disaster tents by the ARC is underway and a vendor will be chosen and a contract initiated by the ARC by 1 December.

*Social welfare:* A memorandum of understanding (MoU) for the three multipurpose social facilities in Düzce and the Marmara region has been submitted to the TRCS for approval. In the meantime, the TRCS Düzce branch has offered their unfettered support in the implementation of the project in both Düzce and Kaynasli.

The Italian Red Cross (IRC) will support a women's centre in the prefabricated housing settlement of Gümüşpınar (Düzce) by providing a catering unit, an internet cafe, a library, a ceramic training centre and a plan for social activities. A minibus has been ordered and will be delivered at the end of the month for use in the catering centre and the kindergarten.

*Health:* The Federation sponsored two staff from the TRCS to attend a first aid training workshop in Budapest from 7 through 12 November. The workshop was organized by the European working group in first aid training which plays an important role in strengthening Red Cross Red Crescent capacity in first aid education quality.

The Norwegian Red Cross (NRC) met with TRCS and the Federation to discuss plans for field hospital training to be carried out in collaboration with the GRC in the Kocaeli/Izmit area. After the necessary replenishment of equipment, the project will be funded by the Australian and British Red Cross Societies and the Federation, through the NRC. Training is planned for the first quarter of 2001.

A specialist from TRCS's blood department was sent to Manchester, England in mid-November by the Spanish Red Cross to visit a factory where four mobile blood collection units are being built. These items will be donated to the TRCS by the Spanish Red Cross to support its blood products programme. In addition, the GRC is considering support for a TRCS blood transfusion/fractionation project .

The GRC has also donated medical equipment to the Karamursel state hospital. The equipment includes a dialysis machine, electrocardiogram, laparoscopy equipment and a defibrillator which will ensure greater medical and surgical efficiency for patients in this area.

*Psycho-social support programme (PSP):* Until the end of October, the Federation's PSP has set up and organized training modules in three locations in the earthquake zone: Avcilar (Istanbul), Izmit and Düzce. The training prepares volunteer community leaders and professional caregivers to identify psycho-social needs in their communities and organize activities to meet those needs. The training modules are held once a month and last three days. A programme agreement with TRCS for sustainability of the PSP is expected to be signed shortly.

The GRC psycho-social programme continues to benefit both the caregivers and the victims in the Kocaeli/Izmit and Bolu/Düzce areas through daily counseling on an individual or group basis. The team has added a local psychologist at the TRCS Yeniköy health and training centre.

The Swiss Red Cross continues its financial support to PSP and in December, the project will be reviewed by a specialist from the Society focusing particularly on local sustainability.

*Water-sanitation:* Work on the Kandira water pipeline, funded by the Swiss Red Cross through the Federation progressed swiftly due to good weather conditions. The project comprises of three components: the reconstruction of a main pipeline damaged during the earthquake which is almost half complete; rehabilitation of primary pipelines and construction of a water collection chamber for which work has commenced; and the repair of a secondary pipeline. The damaged water system services 34,000 people in the Izmit municipality, and is currently functioning at only 50 per cent of its capacity. The project is expected to be completed by the first quarter of next year.

*Construction:* The Federation's construction programmes are progressing well with the design phase and approvals of the Sakary and Düzce Hospitals 90% complete. These projects will go to tender in early 2001 and at present, four contractors have been interviewed. The tender pre-qualification criteria is being developed for approval in conjunction with the health ministry.

A detailed cost estimate for the Derince school project in Izmit and a structural review of the design as proposed is almost in place; the Macarlar school and the Kandira hospital renovations have been successfully tendered and approval from corresponding government institutions has been sought; a consultant for the Bolu and Izmit school projects will be contracted by the end of the month.

The Italian Red Cross (IRC) has laid the foundations for two ECHO funded prefabricated construction projects in Fidanlikevler (Düzce): a women and children care unit which will provide psychological and social support to women; and a polyvalent health centre for health care activities which do not require hospitalisation.

The Spanish Red Cross inaugurated a new hospital in Karamürsel on 17 November and the extension of the Erenler primary school in Adapazari, on 24 November. Both facilities were built with the cooperation of TRCS and were inaugurated in the presence of the Minister of Social Welfare/Education, the Spanish Ambassador, the Vice President of TRCS and representatives from the Federation and sister Societies. The hospital will provide medical services to a population of 30,000 and the school annex is expected to ease the congestion in neighboring schools. The construction of the additional polyclinics by the Spanish Red Cross for the state hospital in Karamursel has also been

completed and the construction of the health centre in Kaynasli is expected to be finished in early December.

Construction of the GRC funded Bolu state hospital is developing well and is expected to be completed at the end of the year.

The French Red Cross (FRC) inaugurated the Paris primary school in Akyazi on 20 November, in the presence of the President of the TRCS, the Minister of Education, the French Ambassador, the Director of the French Red Cross and the Federation head of delegation.

The reconstruction of Golcük Hospital by the FRC with the cooperation of the TRCS and the Turkish health ministry is targeted for completion by 15 December. By the end of December, the oxygen supply networks for the hospital will be installed and inauguration of the hospital is expected in the new year.

*Education/Training:* The Swiss Red Cross has completed a three-month training programme intended to strengthen the social competence of 152 managers of prefabricated settlements in five provinces: Bolu, Düzce, Sakarya, Yalova and Kocaeli. The course curriculum includes: organization, communications, conflict resolution and security with a focus on the prevention and resolution of social problems arising in the prefabricated housing areas. To reduce high levels of unemployment, a professional training course will begin mid-December and will offer training in computer literacy, English, Turkish, office management, and accounting skills. This programme has a time frame of 2.5 years and will benefit the residents of the prefabricated settlement in Kocaeli.

Meanwhile, the Swiss Red Cross has provided sufficient furniture for 122 primary/secondary classrooms in 22 prefabricated schools in Kocaeli.

The Spanish Red Cross is preparing a training of trainers programme in first aid and has produced two books which will be published in December to be used in first aid courses, commencing early 2001. The Spanish Red Cross, in collaboration with the Federation delegation have finalized plans to adapt the books for the Turkish public for use in general first aid training courses.

*Telecommunications:* The Federation and the American Red Cross (ARC) continue to support TRCS with the implementation of a crisis communications enhancement plan. Tenders for the telecommunications equipment were closed on 20 November and the evaluation is presently under way. In the meantime, TRCS is in the process of recruiting technicians for the project.

The ARC, in conjunction with the TRCS and the GRC, has began evaluating tender offers for computer automation equipment for TRCS, with technical support from the Federation delegation.

Negotiation on an MoU is in process between TRCS, in cooperation with the Federation, and Turkey Radio Amateurs Society for cooperation on specific emergency communications.

*Branch Development:* Upon the request of the TRCS, the GRC and the British Red Cross (BRC) will focus on branch development and disaster preparedness in 2001; the BRC is concentrating its efforts on the Erzurum branch in eastern Turkey.

Results of a study commissioned by the GRC on branch development prospects were presented at a meeting held on 21 November. The study was performed in the context of recent relief activities provided by TRCS in the earthquake zone and TRCS branches in western Turkey. The meeting was chaired by the President of the TRCS and participants included TRCS branch managers, representatives from the Federation delegation and PNS representatives. The final report will be translated into Turkish and distributed to all parties interested in TRCS branch activities at the end of November.

## *External Relations*

*Government/UN/NGOs:* The fifth meeting of the International Working Group (IWG) was held on 27 October to discuss disaster mitigation, prevention and preparedness. The meeting was chaired by the Federation, with participants from donor countries, the UN, other intergovernmental agencies and TRCS. Issues discussed included the legal status of international humanitarian organizations, including PNS in Turkey. Another meeting by the IWG members was held on 7 November to discuss the UN Disaster Management Programme (DMP) planned for 2001.

*Media:* TRCS awarded a medal to Saatchi and Saatchi in Istanbul, as a mark of the Society's appreciation the agency's work in producing pro bono a TV spot highlighting Red Cross Red Crescent activities to coincide with the commemoration of the first anniversary of the August 1999 earthquake; the video spot was widely broadcast on national TV across Turkey. A Federation video news release distributed to global TV networks at the same time achieved coverage in a number of countries, including Turkey, Australia, Britain, France, the Netherlands and Spain.

The Spanish Red Cross has produced a publication for public/media distribution highlighting various activities undertaken in Turkey since the earthquake on 17 August 1999.
