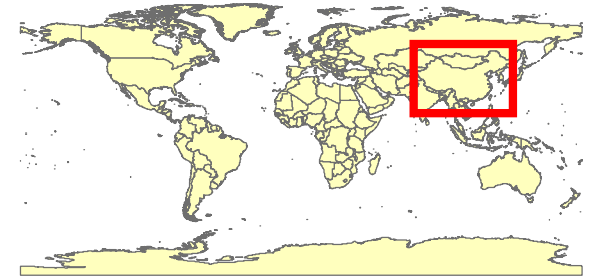

Floods in China

Information Bulletin N° 3

1) 204 people were killed in China and 79 people remain missing because of severe floods, which commenced during the last week of May affecting 16 provinces. Among the worst affected were Hunan, Chongqing, and Guizhou.

2) On 10 June, an additional 92 people were killed of which 88 were primary school students due to flash floods in China's Heilongjiang province. At the moment 17 people remain missing. Seven out of 18 villages in Ning'an were damaged by the floods.

3) Two tornado's struck Liaoning Province on Friday 10 June and Saturday 11 June.

On Friday 10 June, eight people were confirmed dead, thus bringing the total number of dead due to floods and tornados in 2005 to 304, with 31 others injured due to a tornado at Chaoyang County of northeast China's Liaoning Province.

On Saturday 11 June , a tornado struck at 16h00 in Wulanheshuo Township of Chaoyang County, affecting 450 people, devastating more than 200 houses and killing nearly 400 head of domestic animals.

4) More than 13,000 geese were destroyed in Tacheng, in the Xinjiang autonomous region, after about 500 died of H5N1 avian flu, China's Agriculture Ministry reported.
